Dear Parents, Staff and Birali Community,

It's hard to believe that we are halfway through term 1. The seasons are changing and Autumn is now upon us, a time when we get to witness the changing colour of the leaves, the intensity of the summer sun slowly leave us (albeit only slightly!) and the children start to slow down, preparing for the cooler winter months.

To all the new and continuing families we hope your child(ren) are well settled and back into the rhythm and routine that our school can bring and that you get to enjoy the magic the change of seasons brings.

Many of you may not be aware of the role or the work the school Board does as most of it is done in the background, unseen to the majority. This term class 7/8/9 have been hearing the stories of early explorers navigating into the unknown and mapping the world as we know it. Voyages of Discovery has been captivating and heart wrenching as we hear the tales of such explorers as Marco Polo, Christopher Columbus and Ferdinand Magellan. Gaining a better geographical understanding of our world can help us discover ourselves within it.



Next week we begin a Physics main lesson, and we welcome Jenny Agius, from Samford who will be delivering the content and experiments with the class. I am extremely excited to be joining the class and supporting the students throughout this exciting time.

Class 8/9 have also been given a brief for the Year 8/9 Project that continues all year long. It is an individual project of their choosing. The students will be researching, learning, creating and collaborating with a mentor culminating with a finished product to showcase at the end of the year.

Class 4 children have started marimba lessons this term learning the song "Anti-gravity". They are very happy and enthusiastic each week. Their skill of hitting the right notes and playing songs with accurate rhythm is improving. They are also successfully learning to play several three-part songs. It can be confusing when you have to play different rhythm and melody to others, but they are doing very well.



Class 5/6 children are continuing to play more difficult songs than previous terms. The rhythms are becoming more complex. One of the groups performed one song in the hall during Hannah's goodbye gathering. They are also learning "Up & down the stairs" on recorder.

Class 7/8/9 children are also continuing to play more complex songs. Everyone's skills of playing marimba is improving and the more complex songs they play, the happier and more enthusiastic they get as well as feeling very proud of themselves.

Class 5 to 9 children have been practicing recorder ensemble with me and they are all improving their skills. The 7/8/9 students are currently learning "Minuet' on a combination of Soprano, Alto and Ukulele.
